

TRICAMP Staff Position Description:

Employment dates: June 2, 2021- July 3,2021

Cluster Lead: (\$15/hr and 40hrs/wk)

This is the director position that facilitates the virtual classroom portion of a camper's day. The Cluster Lead creates the daily program shaped around the merit badge requirements or Rank Advancements being taught in that cluster. While the Cluster Lead must teach the requirements as written by the National BSA, in a cluster style program the Lead puts the multiple badge's requirements together to create a "super badge". For example, the Photography, Animation, Public Speaking and Movie Making requirements combine to make The Hollywood Experience and Crime Prevention, Fingerprinting, and Law combine to make Civic Involvement. Cluster Leads do not teach their program alone, with the help of their Cluster Staff they create a fun and memorable program that the camper will remember for years to come.

Cluster Staff: (\$15/hr and 40hrs/wk)

Helps the Cluster Lead to create the overall Cluster program. Should be fun, inventive, and reliable. Engages with the participating campers to encourage them to complete their requirements on time.

Guest Speakers:

Each Cluster should have some guest speakers, professionals in a field that connects to the Cluster Program being offered.

Cluster Classroom Times:

Each day, time has been designated as Cluster Classroom time. Below is the Cluster schedule (pacific time):

Monday to Friday

9am-Noon (required)

1-2pm (if extra classroom time is needed)

4:30-5:30pm (if extra classroom time is needed)

Virtual World:

At various times, outside of classroom time, TRICAMP utilizes Mozilla Hubs to provide a virtual world for the campers to interact in a 3D environment. Camp wide activities are done here and any class projects can be displayed here as well. You can also take your class to Mozilla Hubs as a “field trip” to enhance your program.
